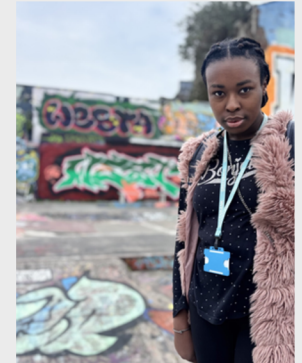
## EXPLORING THE BALTIC TRIANGLE
